



**Gau Mahima Seva Trust (Regd.)**  
**(Activity report -4)**  
(2019)

Activities of Gau Mahima Seva Trust during 2019 are as under:

1. The government of UP constituted a committee to look into the matters related to stray cattle and provide solution to their management and viable alternative. Dr RS Chauhan was made expert member in this committee, who advised the Govt of UP to prepare the shelter houses for cows, and to prepare the biofertilizer and bio pest repellent for natural farming. This will reduce the economic load of agrochemicals and provide organic matter to soil which not only maintain the soil and environmental health but also provide organic food for human beings leading to reduced chance of agrochemical induced diseases.

2. As a member of the Committee for the Purpose of Control and Supervision of Experiments in Animals (CPCSEA) Government of India, Dr RS Chauhan chairman of the Go Mahima Seva Trust made the guidelines on the "Reuse and Rehabilitation of large animals" in which a provision of payment of Rs. 200/- per day per cow as maintenance cost to the AWBI approved rehabilitation centre by the organization who conducted experiments on cows and want to rehabilitate them. This decision of Government of India made a breakthrough in conducting experiments in animals and their maintenance till their natural death. It will reduce the problem of stray cattle and cruelty on them.

3. Chairman of the trust was also in search of a piece of land in UP or Uttarakhand in order to set up a small demonstration unit of gaushala where the dry cows will be kept and from their urine and dung many utility products in order to make this unit self sufficient and create the scope of rural entrepreneurship and provide economic self-reliance to rural youths.

4. Dr RS Chauhan chairman of Go Mahima Seva Trust, delivered several lectures on A1 and A2 milk and Panchgavya products, their advantages and disadvantages with respect to the indigenous cows, cross bred and exotic cows.

5. The department of Telecommunications , Govt of India constituted a committee for developing a draft for SMART VILLAGE in which Dr RS Chauhan was made one of the expert member for developing smart animal husbandry practices in villages. Biosensor technology will be applied a chip will be tagged in animal body through which the control room can record the animal data on their health, movement, production and traceability.

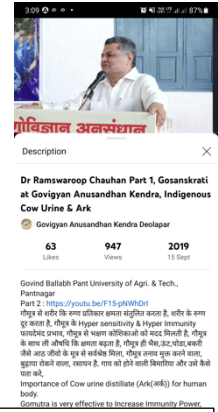


Fig.1. Screen shot of on line lecture delivered on cowpathy
